The competition portion of the event is restricted to students only. Post-docs are welcome to present their posters but are not eligible for prizes. All poster presenters should be listed as the first author and will be guests of the Catalysis Club for the evening. Catalysis Club members and guests will cast their votes for their favorite poster and a panel of judges will select the 5 best posters from the top 10 posters. In the past year, winners have been decided by relatively few votes. Therefore, you should strongly encourage all those who stop at your poster to vote for you to increase your chance of winning! Total prizes in the amount of \$550 will be distributed between the winners with \$150 for the overall winner and \$100 to each of the four other winners. The one overall winner will also be invited to present his or her work at the 2022 - 2023 Season Monthly Meetings. Note: only students registered through the Catalysis Club of Philadelphia will be eligible for the club's prizes. Additionally, registration fees of presenting students will be covered by funds kindly provided by the North American Catalysis Society and the Catalysis Club of Philadelphia.

The Catalysis Club of Philadelphia is very proud of this event and views it as one of the region's premier opportunities for graduate students to showcase their work with their peers and with local chemical industry professionals. All graduate students whose work is either directly or indirectly related to catalysis science and technology are encouraged to submit entries.
